This simple counting song has a complex history. There was a minstrel-show song in the 1860's that included this song, but there is no way to know if the song we now know was "boiled down" from that one, or if someone added words back then to an existing nursery rhyme.

It has become a modern staple of children's music, and there are now hundreds of recordings of it to be found that are all very similar. Bill Haley & the Comets (1954) and the Beach Boys (1962) both recorded rockin' surfstyle versions of it, and the Yardbirds even did a related song with the same title.
