


Hey Loddy Loddy

This one is not as well-known as some of the songs in kid's music books, but our family loves it, and it is very catchy and easy to improvise new words to. The chord changes also come at a perfect pace for beginners. It seems to have an innate tropical or calypso rhythm, and it's very easy for kids to strum away and just think about making up words.

It's called "Hey Lolly Lolly" in some places, and that's the version Woody Guthrie sang on one of his classic recordings. Our favorite version is Chubby Checker's,

that he recorded in 1963.

We like to make the verses all use names of people, and it is good for teaching rhyming. You can just sing verses as long as people have ideas, since putting the chorus in after every verse slows the song down a lot. When there is a slow period with no ideas, sing a chorus or two while somebody thinks of a new rhyme.

We learn songs by listening to them over and over, until they are "in our heads."
